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Overview

The Humber's European Structural and Investment Funds programme 2014-2020 is investing over £99.2m in the Humber through the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), European Social Fund (ESF) and European Agricultural Fund for Rural Development (EAFRD).

To date, a number of programmes have been approved which provide support to SMEs across the LEP area through both investment in Innovation, SME Competitiveness and Low Carbon utilising ERDF funding and through investment in improving the skills levels of individuals through the ESF programme. Additional funding has also been made available direct to businesses through the EAFRD Rural Growth Programme.

There are also a number of programmes that have been commissioned by our neighbouring LEPs which are delivering support in our overlapping areas of East Riding, North and North East Lincolnshire.

The Humber LEP through its Business Growth Hub is keen to ensure that all business support organisations, advisors and intermediaries are aware of the support that is being offered through these programmes, to stimulate cross referrals and make the necessary impact on the SMEs in our area.

This document provides a summary of this support, as well as details of other business support and funding programmes that are currently live which are complementary to the ESIF funded programmes.

The three year scheme provides a programme of interventions aimed at enabling SMEs in the Humber to create and/or adopt new products and processes, improve productivity and business resilience by utilising ICT more effectively to support business growth.

It encourages and supports the uptake of digital technologies, builds business confidence in the use of such technologies and extends understanding of how digital technologies can be employed to solve business problems and deliver increased business competitiveness. This is achieved by the following activities:

- One-to-one advice to determine the needs of the client and to develop an action plan of support required to achieve the objectives
- A comprehensive programme of workshops / masterclasses, delivered by industry experts
- Voucher support to SMEs based on ICT projects identified through one-to-one advice and support from specialist ICT Advisors

The programme also offers a New Start ICT grant to eligible SMEs less than 12 months old to help towards ICT related business start-up costs, for example getting connected to superfast broadband services (minimum of 30mbps). £1,000 grants available for projects totalling £2,000 - £2,500 (for larger projects the general ICT for Growth Grants may be more appropriate). Grant Support under this strand includes:







The Aura Innovation Centre (AIC) will encourage innovative thinking; creating a place where collaboration happens to kick-start the low carbon energy supply chain in Britain's 'energy estuary'. When completed at the end of 2019 the AIC will bring together businesses to develop through innovation a robust and sustainable low carbon energy cluster in the region.

Prior to the Centre opening the AIC's Innovation Managers can facilitate support to businesses to develop new products, from initial idea to prototype, to help businesses enter new markets and supply chains, plus, bring new products to market.

The AIC team will draw widely upon the expertise, skills and resources of the University of Hull in the direct delivery of the bespoke product innovation/development service. - Intellectual property advice and support e.g. IP landscaping and brokering access to specialist IP and legal support
- Support for the early stage commercialisation of new low carbon/offshore wind technologies



N.B. Property purchases, while eligible for funding, are not a priority and will not be supported unless a persuasive case can be made to do so.

Grant funded projects must create at least 1 FTE job for every £15,000 grant awarded and:

- employment must be created within one year of the investment being made
- jobs created should lead to a net increase in the number of employees in the business compared with the average over the previous twelve months
- businesses must commit to sustaining the additional employment for 3 years
