Breakout Space Programme

Breakout 1 – "HEY Business" 11am – 12pm

Facilitated by the HEY Business Growth Hub, this session will hear from a range of business support schemes and organisations that can help businesses to decarbonise and implement sustainable, clean growth activities. With support primarily targeted at SMEs (small and medium sized businesses), each scheme will talk about how they can help businesses to reduce costs and access new markets via low carbon activity and clean growth. Delegates will take away from this session advice and guidance on how business costs can be cut alongside carbon emissions.

Delegates will hear from each support scheme before having the opportunity to ask questions as part of a Q&A session.

Breakout 2 - "HEY Community" 1.30pm - 2.30pm

Facilitated by the Hull & East Yorkshire Local Nature Partnership, this breakout session will explore how community groups and natural-world organisation are playing their part in tackling the climate crisis through a range of projects and initiatives.

Delegates will hear from a number of schemes before having the opportunity to ask questions as part of a Q&A session.

Delegates will hear how fellow regional businesses have embedded net zero principles and clean growth approaches throughout their business operations and how they are now seeing dividends as a result. Delegates will take away from this session real life examples of low carbon activity that they can apply to their own businesses, and how this can give then a competitive advantage to access new markets and win more customers.

Schools Events

Micro-Tyco Innovate Schools Competition

Ferens Art Gallery, Carr Lane, Hull, HU1 3RA 9.30am to 2.30pm

The HEY LEP Employment & Skills Team, supported by the HEY Careers Hub and the social enterprise WildHearts Group, will host an interactive and immersive day of learning, activities, and challenges for secondary school students.

Students will undertake a condensed version of the WildHearts "*Micro-Tyco Innovate*" programme, where they are challenged in teams of five to create innovative solutions to a societal or environmental issue in their school or community. At the end of the session, students will then be invited to pitch their idea (3 minutes per team) to a mixed panel of public sector and industry judges.

LEP staff will host the physical session in the theatre of the Ferens Art Gallery whilst WildHearts will deliver live the various group sessions virtually over big-screen.

Sustainability Lesson Plan

For students not able to attend the *Micro-Tyco Innovate* session on Monday 18 October, the LEP Employment & Skills Team supported by the Careers Hub have developed a sustainability lesson plan that secondary schools in Hull & East Yorkshire can utilise on the day itself. This series of 30-minute interactive lesson plans have been developed in partnership with industry experts that introduce secondary school students to the topic of sustainability, its importance and how they as young people can play their part in making the world a fairer, more sustainable place.

The lesson plans cover key topics such as Sustainable Food, Sustainable Recycling & Packaging, and Sustainable Supply Chains.

Climate Awareness Assembly

Finally, the LEP team have also developed a "Morning Climate Awareness Assembly" that secondary schools can host during the first week of COP26 on w/c 01 November 2021. Each school will select five senior students to help organise and deliver a 20-minute Climate Awareness Assembly for Year 9 students. All students selected to help with the assembly will be provided with an event brief and checklist to support them. This is a great opportunity to inform and empower students whilst raising awareness of climate change in their school.



Zero Carbon Tour Battle Bus

Queen Victoria Square, Hull, HU1 3RA

The Zero Carbon Tour "Battle Bus" will bring the social enterprise Planet Mark to the event on Monday 18th October. Whilst the bus itself will not be accessible to the public, it will be parked in Queen Victoria Square directly in-between Hull City Hall and the Ferens Art Gallery between **10am and 4pm**. Carrying a bright electric blue livery and featuring "Race to Zero" and "COP26" branding the bus will make for a fantastic photo opportunity for event delegates, members of the public, and the media alike. City of Culture Volunteers will be on duty next to the bus to explain to the public the importance of the bus, why it has travelled to the region, and the details surrounding COP26 and the Race to Zero.
